2020/127	<p><u>TO DISCUSS THE FUNDING BOOST FOR HIGH STREETS AND AGREE FURTHER ACTION IF NECESSARY</u></p> <p>The Clerk advised that RMBC had applied for £20million to improve the High Street in Rotherham town centre and that they had been granted £13million. She also advised that the MP had written to Robert Jenrick about the state of Dinnington High Street and how it needed investment. The Clerk requested permission to write to the RMBC Chief Executive and the MP to advise them of the need for investment in Maltby High Street.</p> <p>RESOLVED: that the Clerk writes a letter on the Councils behalf to the Chief Executive of RMBC and the MP for Rother Valley regarding the High Street.</p>
2020/128	<p><u>ITEMS REQUESTED BY COUNCILLORS</u></p> <p>Brass Bands – Councillor Biggin Councillor Biggin informed Council how well the brass bands were received in December and requested that Maltby Brass Band be booked again for December 2021.</p> <p>RESOLVED: that the Clerk speaks to the band secretary and books bands for 2021</p> <p>Skips – Councillor Heaps Councillor Heaps advised the Council that due to there not being skips over the past year the rubbish had started to accumulate, she requested that as soon as skips/clear up days were allowed, that the area of China Town be allocated 2 skips. She also requested that RMBC are asked if they could send the white goods van out to collect old fridges etc that had been ‘dumped’ on the clear up days.</p> <p>Traffic Count/Timings, Tickhill Road – Councillor Sutton Item Deferred.</p> <p>Maltby District Nursing Team – Councillor Biggin Councillor Biggin advised that sadly the lead nurse for Maltby District Nursing Team had been moved to a different location outside of Maltby, she asked for the Council to write to the NHS to express how well this team worked together and the need for the continuity at this time for residents within Maltby. Councillor Biggin also advised</p>

	<p>that during the pandemic the Clerk, herself and the district nursing team had worked very well together supporting residents and even standing to pay respects to residents who had sadly passed away.</p> <p>RESOLVED: that a letter is sent to the NHS to express how disappointed Maltby Town Council are that the Maltby District Nursing Team have had their lead nurse removed.</p> <p>Defibrillators – Councillor Tinsley Councillor Tinsley advised that a resident had spoken to him about having a community defibrillator installed somewhere around the Lumley area. Councillor Tinsley further advised that he felt the defibrillator would benefit from being in a more prominent area, the Council discussed areas around China Town, Tickhill Road and Lumley estate. It was agreed for Councillors Tinsley & Heaps to look into where a defibrillator could be fitted to benefit the community.</p>
