



**Minutes of Maltby Town Council Full Council Meeting**  
**Held on Thursday 4<sup>th</sup> November 2021**

	<p><b>Present:</b> Councillors: Biggin (Chairperson), Bailey, Beresford, Bradford, Caster, Fitzgibbons, Kirk, Lines, McMahon, Rodgers, Sutton, Tinsley, and Webster.</p> <p><b>Also in attendance:</b> S Youngman, Town Clerk, and 20 members of the public.</p>
2021/128	<p><u>APOLOGIES AND REASON FOR ABSENCE</u></p> <p>Cllr Stringer.</p> <p><b>RESOLVED:</b> That the apologies be approved.</p>
2021/129	<p><u>DECLARATIONS OF DISCLOSABLE PECUNIARY INTEREST</u></p> <p>Cllr Bradford: Item 9b. Cllr Lines: 9g.</p>
2021/130	<p><u>PUBLIC PARTICIPATION</u></p> <p>A member of the public thanked Cllr’s Beresford and Tinsley for dealing with several issues and asked whether other Councillors would take ownership of matters raised by members of the public.</p> <p>A member of the public questioned why the firework event was cancelled. Cllr Biggin explained that the event was cancelled due to the increase in local COVID-19 cases and a shortage of stewards to manage the event.</p> <p>A member of the public questioned why the firework even could not be held at Maltby Miners Sports Ground. The Clerk confirmed that an enquiry had been made to hold the event on the grounds, but permission had not been granted.</p> <p>Cllr Biggin read a statement from Cllr Stringer (Vice-Chair of the Events Committee) concerning the decision to cancel the firework event.</p> <p>A member of the public raised concerns regarding road safety at the Christmas Light Switch On event and suggested the Council investigate arranging a road closure.</p> <p>A member of the public requested an update on the proposal to install fencing around Limesway allotments. The Clerk confirmed that the General-Purpose committee would be reviewing quotes at the next meeting on the 11<sup>th</sup> of November.</p>

	<p>Two members of the public raised concerns with planning application RB2021/1746, the proposal would add to the parking problems on Blyth Road and the cause privacy issues for neighbouring residents. Cllr Biggin advised that the Council would be discussing the application later in the meeting.</p> <p>A member of the public requested a progress report on Maltby Craggs and questioned whether the project had benefited the local wildlife. Cllr Bradford explained the purpose of leaving the meadow to develop naturally. Cllr McMahon suggested the General-Purpose discuss the matter further.</p> <p>A member of the public raised concerns with the water run off from the car wash on Rotherham Road. Cllr Ball explained that the issue is being dealt with by RMBC.</p> <p>A member of the public raised concerns with an increase in anti-social behaviour in White City and Birks Holt. Cllr Biggin agreed to meet with the resident to discuss the matter further and advised that Maltby Town Council have written to the director of Children’s Services to ask what provisions are available to the young people of Maltby.</p> <p>A discussion took place regarding how to report crimes and Police presence in the town.</p>
