He further asked about the 20 mph designation for streets. The Borough Councillors agreed to respond.</li> <li>• A member of the public said that 12 years ago, fencing was deemed too expensive at Milton Street, and that DEFRA and Yorkshire Wildlife were to be approached for funding for hedges. The Chair said this had been considered, things had changed, and that quotes had been obtained for fencing. The member of the public said he was happy with the response. He further asked why the Coalfield Regeneration Trust had not been contacted earlier for funding (it is on the agenda). The Chair explained that the agenda item was not for funding, but rather about working together with the CRT.</li> <li>• A member of the public was concerned about the absence of minutes on the Council's website. The Chair apologised and explained that this was due to a staff shortage. The individual added that he was not happy because minutes did not record the action taken on matters raised in the public session.
