The Clerk informed the Council that she was still awaiting a reply to her email re the air pollution from RMBC and would chase. • Lagoons – a resident raised his concerns regarding the lagoons on the pit top. The resident was advised that the Lagoons were on the agenda, and that his comments would be taken into account when the item was discussed. • A634 – a resident advised the Council that he had spoken to an officer at RMBC regarding the footpath on the A634.

2018/324	<p><u>REPORT FROM THE POLICE</u></p> <p>Councillor Bakewell attend the Council meeting to give an update on the present statistics. She reiterated, that residents needed to report crime as a lot isn't reported and the police are unaware. Members raised problems with cars racing around the town on an evening and cars parking fully on the footway on the High Street.</p>
2018/325	<p><u>ON-GOING ISSUES</u></p> <p>Defibrillators</p> <p>The Clerk advised that she had 3 areas for the defibrillators but was waiting for confirmation from RMBC for 2 of them, she was advised of 2 other businesses that could be tried. The Clerk also advised that she had contacted Start a Heart, to request funding towards the outside cases.</p> <p>SYLTE Bus Timetable</p> <p>Council were informed that the Clerk was emailed the new timetable but it was recalled very quickly by SYLTE, prior to the recall, the Clerk had managed to view the timetable and noted that it was poor for the residents of Maltby. Members raised that a lot of buses had 'out of service' or 'back to depot' on them when the service should have been running.</p> <p>RESOLVED: that the Clerk contacts SYLTE to ascertain why some buses are out of service to residents when they are timetabled and to ask for a copy of the new timetable.</p> <p>Lagoons on the Pit Top</p> <p>RESOLVED: that the Clerk contacts HSE to ascertain if they are happy with the safety provision on the pit top.</p> <p>Loneliness Project</p> <p>The Clerk advised that she had sent an email to advise that the Council were interested in the loneliness project, to date no one from RMBC had been back in touch to advise how the Council could be involved. Councillor Price informed the Council that he would contact the Cabinet member for this area and request that an officer contacts the Clerk.</p> <p>A634</p> <p>Council were advised that the Clerk had received a reply to the Councils request for a meeting with an officer from the Borough, unfortunately, the officer had suggested that a meeting didn't go ahead until all the works were completed.</p> <p>RESOLVED: that the Clerk contacts RMBC to advise them that MTC are unhappy with their suggestion and ask again that a meeting is organised prior to the scheme being completed.</p>
